Oklahoma Baptists Pastors' Conference to feature inspiring testimonies, Nov. 13

DEL CITY—A strong slate of speakers is offered for this year's Oklahoma Baptists Pastors' Conference, Nov. 13 at Del City, First Southern. Brad Graves, pastor of Ada, First and Pastors' Conference president, recently announced who will be speaking at the event. He described the list of speakers as "a mix of nationally-known pastors and several Oklahoma Baptist pastors."

John Avant, president of Life Action Ministries, is one of the nationally-known pastors who will be speaking, as well as Jordan Easley, pastor of Cleveland, Tenn., First, and Philip Nation, vice president of Thomas Nelson Bible Publishers.

Representing Oklahoma Baptist pastors as Pastors' Conference speakers will be Alton Fannin, pastor of Ardmore, First, and Adam Mask, pastor of Coweta, Community.

Along with the featured speakers, this year's Pastors' Conference will have testimonies shared from a long-time lead pastor, an executive pastor and an Oklahoma Baptist University (OBU) student.

Rusty Fuller has been lead pastor of Ada, Trinity since 1984. He and the

church were <u>featured</u> in the <u>Baptist Messenger</u> in 2014, when the congregation observed a Baptism Sunday. The church staff said they prepared for 20 baptisms that day but ended up with 26 people responding and being baptized.

Drew Wright serves as executive pastor at Jenks, First. The *Baptist Messenger* featured Wright in 2018, not long after he experienced the loss of his wife Shannon and his son Asa who was delivered by an emergency caesarean section procedure. Shannon died Dec. 29, 2017, and Asa joined his mother on Jan. 3.

"As the story of Shannon and Asa spread across the internet, believers and non-believers across the country and world reached out to Wright in support," the *Messenger* story shared.

Ethan Wolfe is a full-time OBU student and is serving as youth pastor at Purcell, Emmanuel. He will be observing a recent tradition at the Pastors' Conference of having an OBU pastoral student deliver a message.

"We are excited to be together, most importantly to worship the Lord and to learn from one another," Graves said in a video promoting the Pastors' Conference. "Our theme is called, 'Be Satisfied in Him.' Of all the things in the world that (we) can find our satisfaction in, it should be the Lord Jesus Christ Himself. Join me and many other pastors Nov. 13."
