WOMEN'S RETREAT CHALLENGES ATTENDEES TO HAVE 'DARING FAITH'

DAVIS—On the weekend of Aprill 11 and 12, Falls Creek Conference Centers hosted the Spring Oklahoma Baptists Women's Retreat. This year's theme was "Daring Faith" and attendees walked through the entire book of Esther.

The keynote speaker for the retreat was Kelly Minter author of *Esther: Daring Faith for Such a Time as This.* Her sessions focused on the major shifts in the story of Esther, showing how Esther answered God's calling and how God did the heavy lifting to make those shifts happen. Minter also gave historical context of the time period so attendees could understand what Esther was going through. Minter emphasized that we need to listen and answer God's calling.

"God opened a door for Esther, but not before she knocked on it," Minter said. "God will accomplish His will one way or another; it's up to us if we want to be part of it."

Other speakers included Caroline Saunders, writer and Bible teacher; Melissa Spoelstra, women's conference speaker, Bible teacher and author; and Julie Busler, author of *Joyful Sorrow*. Worship was led by Matt Roberson and the Singing ChurchWomen of Oklahoma.

In line with walking through the book of Esther, attendees could also partake in an Esther Experience. This immersive, physical walk-through event brought various events from the book of Esther to life, enabling participants to visualize how life might have been for the Jews who remained in Persia after they were permitted to return to their homeland.

"I am a kinesthetic leaner, and this experience really helped me to grasp the different parts of the Esther story," said one participant from Clinton, First. "I feel like I understand it much better!"

This event not only encouraged women, but it also strengthened them and challenged them to live boldly in faith.

"It was a beautiful weekend," said Jinger Bernhardt from Perkins, Immanuel. "I'm excited to see how our Oklahoma

WILDFIRE AND TORNADO CLEANUP EFFORTS BY OKLAHOMA BAPTIST DR CONTINUE

Oklahoma Baptist Disaster Relief (DR) continues to work helping homeowners impacted by the March 14 wildfires and the April 2 tornadoes.

Starting on April 14, all fire-related work requests are handled through the DR response site at Stillwater, Countryside.

There are teams staying at the church and working each day. There are also teams commuting from home, making day trips to work. These teams are working in both the Stillwater and Mannford areas.

In total, DR has received more than 160 work requests and have completed almost 100 of those requests over the past three weeks. Teams are scheduled to work through Thursday, April 17, and then return on Monday, April 21 to work until jobs have been completed.

In response to the April 2 tornado damage in the Owasso area, local teams are being utilized to assist the homeowners in the area requesting assistance.

Over the last month, DR has received assistance from other disaster relief ministries from surrounding states.

"Oklahoma Baptists are grateful for the partners we have in the disaster relief ministry because many times we could not do all the recovery that needs to be done without their help," said Jason Yarbrough, state director of Oklahoma Baptist DR.

Initially, teams from Texas traveled up to assist Oklahoma DR in the response and for the next two weeks a group of Mennonites will be assisting DR.

Cole Wheeler (Pryor, Life Fellowship), who was saved and called to the ministry while at youth camp at Falls Creek, said "seeing students lives changed in a similar way is one of the most rewarding things during my time in ministry so far."

The spiritual impact of a week at Falls Creek is generational and comes in a variety of ways. From worship, to preaching, to breakouts, to connection to other believers, to missions mobilization and more, Falls Creek youth camp remains faithful to the Gospel and focused on the church while packed with activity and opportunities.

Bret Lalli (McAlester, First), reported hundreds of spiritual decisions in their group in recent years that range from salvations and rededications to kids called to ministry and missions leaving a powerful legacy for Christ in our youth ministry."


