Oklahoma Baptist pastors, church members, friends and others are invited to attend a special open house event at the new offices on Thursday, May 15, from 1 to 3 p.m.



MEN'S RETREAT ENCOURAGES AND DRAWS MEN FROM ACROSS THE STATE

On April 26, 2024, the Men's Retreat ended with a challenge. To move the event back to the larger room venue, the Tabernacle (TAB), we would need to "Take a brother" (TAB). On April 25, 2025, after six years of waiting, the sound of more than twelve hundred men singing praises filled the Tabernacle as Matt Roberson led worship.

The men accepted the challenge in a great way, and God answered the prayers of men from across the state. One of the most encouraging aspects of the 25th Men's Retreat was the presence of many first-time attendees. The retreat continues to draw men from across Oklahoma and beyond, including participants from Texas and chaplains from Tinker Air Force Base.

In 2024, attendees requested breakout sessions at the Men's Retreat. This year, we held six repeating breakouts and one major breakout on Saturday. One attendee applauded and noted, "Every breakout was full." This demonstrated that the men were hungry to be equipped and challenged.

Friday night's main session began with Tarvoris "Coach Tee" Uzoigwe, Oklahoma Baptists evangelism and apologetics ministry partner, who posed the question: can we truly celebrate on Sundays when no one is rescuing the lost with the Gospel?

He invited a former student named Andre, who shared a powerful testimony about overcoming his fear of sharing the Gospel. The evening concluded with Josh Smith, who emphasized the need for godly men in both the church and the home, asserting that such men will change the world. He suggested that Adam's first sin might have been his failure to confront Satan while he was tempting Eve.

The morning session was opened by Sam Porter, who initiated the Men's Retreat at Falls Creek 25 years ago. He highlighted the importance of seeking God's plan for our lives. Sam was honored with the Laddie Adams Lifetime Achievement Award for his many years of service in Disaster Relief, presented by Jason Yarbrough, the state director for Disaster Relief.

Keith Burkhart, the state men's director who coined the term "Rewired" for the Men's Retreat, closed the retreat by challenging the men to be obedient to the command of making disciples. The messages deeply resonated with the attendees, leading many to accept Christ and seek prayer.

The morning session also featured the annual awards for competition winners. The champions of cornhole were Josh and Stephen from Frederick, First; the dodgeball winners came from Velma Baptist Church; Stephen from Frederick, First won the 5K; Kolby and Rick from El Reno, Prarie View took the pickleball championship; and Casey Estes won the archery competition.

For years, the Newalla, First Men's Ministry has served at the Men's Retreat, often led by John Walker. This year marked the first time he was able to attend after his wife had been ill for the past two years. A special thank you goes to the Men's Retreat volunteers, the Falls Creek Staff, Sportsman United 4 Christ, Disaster Relief for providing lunch on Friday, Steve Wood for grilling, the Lighthorse Police Department for bringing their Bearcat, and Travis David for coordinating the shooting competition.

COMMUNICATORS REFLECT ON WORK DONE 'ALL IN THE NAME OF THE LORD' AT 2025 BCA WORKSHOP

SAN ANTONIO (BCA) – Baptist communicators from across the nation made their way to Alamo City April 21-24, for the annual Baptist Communicators Association (BCA) spring workshop.

Each keynote and breakout session strived to equip the nearly 70 workshop attendees with tools to add to their professional toolbelts as well as a healthy reminder of why what they do matters, not just for the here and now, but for eternity.

LESSONS LEARNED

After a brief devotional led by BCA Program Chair Heather Penna of Texas Baptists, keynote speaker Kristin Cole, founder and CEO of KC Communications, kicked off the first full day of the workshop.

Cole, who specializes in crisis communications, focused her time on the importance of building and sustaining trust with clients, especially as professionals seeking to reflect Christ.

Following Cole, Jeremy Honea, creative director of e3 Partners, continued the thread of reflecting the Lord through the craft of communications in a keynote address titled, "Co-Creators with God."

"Anything that we create, design [or] communicate that is designed to make more believers is us using our craft to physically build the temple continually," he said.

The trend of memorable keynote sessions carried through into the next two days of the workshop as communicators heard from Katie Frugé, director of Texas Baptists' Center for Cultural Engagement; Jonathan Malm, author and entrepreneur, most notable for his work with Sunday Social; and Matt Miller, Founder Principal of MAS Media.

Workshop guests also enjoyed a special lunch time panel on the first day of the workshop, which featured those who received a Grand Prize in the 2024 Wilmer C. Fields Awards Competition.

A HISTORIC NIGHT

Communicators dressed in their best Texan attire April 22 and filled Casa Rio, the first restaurant to open along the San Antonio River Walk in 1946, for the 61st annual Wilmer C. Fields Awards Ceremony. BCA members also honored Jim Veneman, renowned photographer, photo editor and photojournalism professor, as a Lifetime Member. BCA Lifetime Members are selected from current or former members who have given significant service to the field of communications.

Veneman has been a member of BCA since 1984. He is the only member to serve as president for four terms and the only president to serve in three different decades. Jim accepted the Lifetime Membership honor and award with his wife Carol in San Antonio.

SERVING TOGETHER AND LOOKING AHEAD

Before the conclusion of the 2025 BCA workshop, members voted on and welcomed new officers for the 2025-26 term. Outgoing president Bobby Puffenburger from Bay Leaf Baptist Church in North Carolina, passed the gavel to newly elected president Brandon Elrod of the North American Mission Board.

The workshop concluded with a service project that had members filling mission bags for Texas Baptists River Ministries.

BCA's 71st annual spring workshop will be April 2026 in Alabama. Members attending the 2025 SBC Annual Meeting in Dallas are encouraged to attend the BCA dessert fellowship June 8 at 9 p.m.


